With violence in our streets, the ongoing, seemingly endless war in Ukraine, the escalation in the Mid-East, political party division, the impact of inflation, on top of everything else we have going on in our personal lives, there's no end in sight. For many of us, we think we can't possibly break the worry habit.

But I think we've forgotten that Jesus is all about change, about breaking us free from the natural tendency to worry. All our fears and anxiety rob us of the joy God has for us. As you move through the glorious spring month of May, choose the peace of God by surrendering your worries and entrusting your cares to him. He's listening!



With the exciting news that the 2024 Wisznat/LeFavre Memorial Scholarship Award will be increasing from \$750 to \$1000 for qualifying applicants, new guidelines have been established to recognize candidates as active church members, a mandatory component for our church scholarship. A list of church-based activities with assigned point values, ranging from attending church to participating in church services or churchbased community service opportunities, is available on our church website. These activities are suggested as they represent important aspects of the life of our church, and many could be completed during breaks in school calendars. Each candidate will be required to accrue a minimum of 10 points over the course of a school year and log each of their actions in the Scholarship Applicants' Notebook located in the back of the church. As they are being notified of this change mid-year, candidates will only need to earn 5 points for the 2024 scholarship application by the mid-June deadline. This log will be one part of the application process that will become available in the spring.

Please note: *Applicants are responsible for recording each of their activities in the Scholarship Applicants'* Notebook <u>as they complete them.</u>



#### The Margate Community Church Pulpit Committee -

#### **Final Report**

The purpose of this communication is to announce the disbanding of the Pulpit Committee and to summarize for the congregation a brief history of the process and the work that transpired.

The Pulpit Committee would like to thank the congregation for their generous participation in a church survey and two "Chat and Chew" conversations. The information from those sources concluded the first phase of our work together, a congregational "self-study." In order to know what sort of Senior Minister we need, we first asked what sort of church we are and where we think God is leading us in the future. We came together during the "Chat and Chew" events to discuss the important issues of our identity and calling. The dialogue was very fruitful, resulting in clear statements of our values, concrete directions in which to focus our energy, and a sense of our trajectory, or where we thought we needed to go.

To summarize the results from the survey and the "Chat and Chew" events, where we talked about what we value most about our church, we said that Margate Community Church is a:

1. A welcoming church who values authentic relationships.

- 2. A Church who values mission and outwardly-focused service.
- 3. A spiritual community who values ecumenical and interdenominational connections.
- 4. A worshipping community who values depth and reverence in music and word.
- 5. A learning community who values education for children, youth, and adults.

After the "Chat and Chew" results were shared with the congregation, the Pulpit Committee moved into a less visible phase. We developed two important documents: a Church Profile, which described the nature and vision of our church, and the Congregation Opportunity Form which was posted on the UCC Ministry Opportunities web page. We submitted the Church Profile in March of 2023. In addition to being posted on the UCC Ministry Opportunities web page, the profile was posted on a Christian Career Center job search and on the job boards of Yale Divinity School and Princeton Theological Seminary. Next, we moved into the search phase, where we actively sought the person who we would present to the church as our next Senior Minister. During this phase, we diligently reviewed resumes and videos from 44 applicants. We conducted preliminary and follow-up interviews. We even traveled to another church to view a finalist leading a service.

Earlier in March, Rev. Ney shared her decision not to retire and expressed an interest in remaining as our Minister. Reverend Ney officially submitted that request to the Pulpit committee. With that turn of events, our potential candidates withdrew their names from consideration. Upon review of the Church By-laws, the Pulpit Committee ultimately determined that there was no longer a need to continue our search to replace our sitting minister. The committee then further agreed that we should end the search process and disband our committee.

Our final report was submitted to the Board of Trustees, who have now accepted Reverend Ney's offer to continue as Pastor of the Margate Community Church.

With this report to our congregation, this final step officially concludes the work of the Pulpit committee and now ends the search process.

While the committee disbanded without a new call, we feel that our efforts in preparing a Church Survey and conducting "Chat and Chew" events were beneficial to the Congregation as a whole. We sincerely hope that the Advisory Committee or other church boards will continue with this introspection.

Throughout the search process, we received indispensable assistance from Rev. Craig Peterson, the UCC Conference minister that includes New Jersey. Rev. Peterson recommended that Rev. Ney and other church boards actively participate in the New Jersey Conference by attending annual meetings and upcoming events. We hope that this will be considered. Rev. Peterson emphasized that this would help the church to be more visible to UCC candidates the next time a search takes place for a Senior Minister.

The congregation will need to decide when to elect another Pulpit Committee. The committee is typically formed when a minister announces his/her retirement date. This Pulpit Committee learned much about the process over the last several years. Again, the recommendations provided by our conference minister will help streamline a future search and call. The next Pulpit Committee may want to consider the possibility of hiring a headhunter to assist with the search. In addition, we learned that there is a need to be very timely and responsive so as to not lose a desirable candidate to another church.

In closing we want to thank the congregation for its support, patience and understanding. This has been a long and arduous process for the committee and probably the congregation as well. We now pray and look forward to continued success, growth, and guidance as Reverend Ney continues her leadership of the Margate Community Church.
